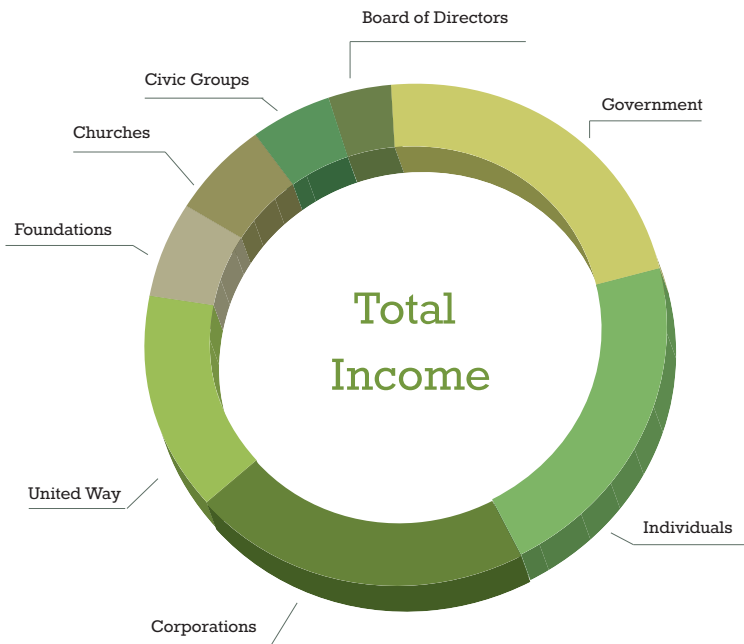
It is impossible to tell you how much everyone means to me. All the mentors and staff were so warm and helpful in each way I needed them.

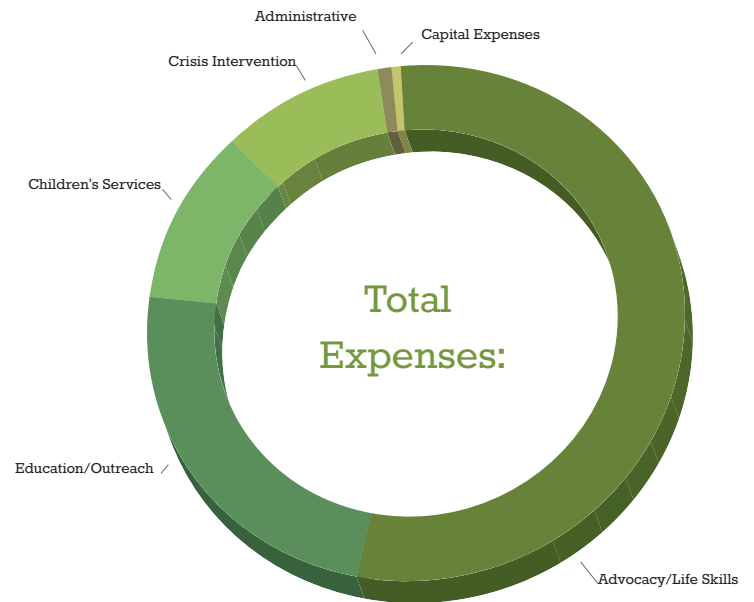

Lives are changing

During 2012, almost 300 women and children called Sheltering Wings home.

We provided resources to more than 1,000 crisis callers in 2012.

We educated over 20,000 adults and teens about domestic violence.

We received almost \$120,000 of in-kind donations and 5,000 hours of help from generous volunteers.

These are preliminary, unaudited year-end figures and may differ slightly from the final figures we will report to the state and federal governments. Our finances are reviewed annually by an independent public accounting firm. Every day, we receive reminders that the need is great, lives are changing, and our work must continue.

The past year saw the substantial completion of our shelter facility's expansion from 11,000 to 34,000 square feet. We rejoice at the growth, but not at what has created the need. The additional space allowed us to provide safe housing for a record number of women and children during 2012. While that is impressive, consider that more than 12,000 families have called us when in crisis over the past decade. The need is great.

We find great hope and joy in the messages we receive from our residents. We see lives transformed in tangible ways. Women who had lost all hope now radiate unshakeable confidence. Children sleep soundly without fear, and families rediscover the simple joy of laughter. Lives are changing.

Like every organization, whether it is a for-profit or a not-for-profit, we regularly ask ourselves how we are doing and what we could do to improve. After a decade of successfully changing lives, our Board is focused on sustaining the work we do. Our work must continue.

Our board is refreshing and aligning our mission, reviewing our funding sources, and studying our services to ensure that we are prepared for the foreseeable future. We deeply appreciate the generous support you have provided and for the prayers you have offered on behalf of the women and children we serve. The need is great, lives are changing, and our work must continue.

Our Work Must Continue

PROVIDING MORE THAN SHELTER

Some people assume that the only thing we do is provide a safe haven for women who are trying to escape domestic violence. But Sheltering Wings is and does so much more.

CRISIS SERVICES

Staff members with specialized training take calls from women in danger 24 hours a day. We use standardized assessments to gauge the degree of danger, so we can recommend the best course of action (which may include contacting law enforcement).

ADVOCACY & LIFE SKILLS

We help women prepare for a return to a safe, secure life outside the shelter by strengthening the life skills they need to parent children, find financial freedom, cope with stress, recognize the signs of harm in future relationships, and find legal representation.

CHILDREN

We work with children to rebuild relationships damaged by abuse, teach them about healthy relationships, and minimize the likelihood that they will enter into abusive relationships or become abusers themselves in the future.

OUTREACH & EDUCATION

Preventing domestic violence today and in the future requires public education. While our most urgent mission is providing safety to victims of domestic abuse and their children, our outreach programs provide a vital service to the communities we serve. Our **Teen dating violence prevention** is an interactive program for schools and youth groups and it teaches teens how to recognize early signs of abuse, using a video, role play, and statistics relevant to teens. We also provide **in-service presentations**: These presentations provide large and small businesses effective ways to educate employees about domestic abuse, awareness of symptoms that women are in unsafe relationships, and steps to take when abuse is suspected. Observed each October, **Domestic Violence Prevention Awareness Month** includes our most visible broad-based efforts. Activities friends and family-style presentations, countywide clergy training, and additional Ten Dating Violence programs. Our quarterly **Shared Blessings** newsletter and other publications inform supporters, churches, and community leaders of current activities and ways to make a difference. Each issue includes various outreach and educational items about domestic violence and sexual assault to better enable readers to understand the issues, identify women in unsafe relationships, and know how to best help them. Thanks to generous partners like INCASA and IU Health, Sheltering Wings is able to provide this outreach and education.



YOUTH COUNCIL

Our Youth Council helps us educate teens about the realities of domestic violence. Youth Council members help us stay connected to young people in the community and ensure that our efforts are relevant and meaningful.

INDIVIDUAL VOLUNTEERS

We have many volunteer opportunities for individuals or groups, who can provide much-needed services to the shelter and our women and children. All volunteers go through an orientation program, and may need a drug screen and background check.

Without the dedicated service and support we receive from the community, Sheltering Wings would be unable to accomplish as much as we do every year. As you consider how you can help Sheltering Wings, you may want to explore one of the many planned giving strategies described below. Many of these strategies offer substantial tax benefits. Your attorney, accountant, financial planner or banker will explain how to use these strategies.

Employer matching. Many companies match donations made by their employees, which can double or triple the impact of your generosity. Ask your Human Resources department for information about your employer's program.

Stock Gifts. If you own shares of stock that you no longer need, donating them to Sheltering Wings may allow you to take a substantial tax deduction.

Bequests. As you prepare your will, please consider designating a set amount or percentage as a bequest to Sheltering Wings. If you already have a will, ask your attorney to add a codicil that reflects your wishes.

Life Estate Arrangements. With this type of giving, you can donate your home, land or other property to Sheltering Wings, but continue to use that property for life.

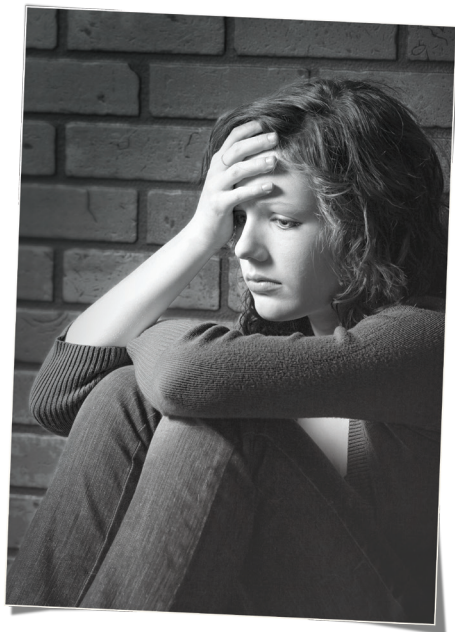
Insurance Gifts. If your dependents are financially secure, you may not need all of your life insurance coverage. Designating Sheltering Wings as a beneficiary for part or all of your benefits – or taking out a new policy listing us as beneficiary – may offer tax advantages.

Annuities. Purchasing a charitable gift annuity or a lifetime annuity allows you to make a gift now, and receive an income as long as you and your beneficiaries live.

Charitable Remainder Trusts. This approach allows you to make a gift to Sheltering Wings and provide you and your spouse with long-term income and an immediate tax deduction. The full amount goes to Sheltering Wings when the trust period ends.

Charitable Lead Trusts. These trusts allow Sheltering Wings to benefit from your gift for a specified period, with the assets then returning to you or your beneficiaries.

Sheltering Wings is a 501(c)3 not-for-profit organization, and donations are tax-deductible to the extent allowed by law. We cannot provide advice on tax or legal matters, and recommend that you consult with your attorney, accountant or other professional tax advisor.
