To Our Caring Community of Supporters:

It's been an interesting couple of years ... and not only because of COVID.

The pandemic compounded the economic and emotional challenges of families escaping domestic violence and altered how we serve them. Still, we didn't let the stresses and strains of the pandemic keep Sheltering Wings from growing – largely thanks to your support.

We completed an aggressive four-year strategic plan in 2021. Among other initiatives, this plan included opening a community resource center, restructuring staff for better efficiency, building a unit for male survivors and creating a mobile advocacy program so families who don't need safe housing can still access our services. And we opened Haven Homes with partners RealAmerica and Cummins Behavioral Health (not originally in the plan!), a permanent supportive housing community with 52 apartments.

All those initiatives (and more) during a pandemic. Most had been in the works for a few years, so bringing them to fruition in 2021 felt extra special.

We're proud of what we've accomplished. As you read this annual report, we hope you will be, too. You've worked arm in arm with us during your own pandemic experiences, still lending your financial support, volunteer time, program assistance and community partnership.

As much as we like to talk about our programs and services, **we really like to point to the lives you've helped save** and the commitments you've allowed families to make to build safe, stable and independent lives.

Together, our role is to walk alongside families escaping domestic violence and support them in transforming their lives. As you'll see from this report, we've been able to do just that – together.

The stories we've shared this year of survivors trying to "build a new house on the rock" (Matthew 7:24-25) are just a glimpse into the lives of the people you've given hope to.

People like:

... **Linda, who went from living with her little daughter in an old Chevrolet to helping other abuse survivors.** She endured her husband's abuse because, "I thought I deserved it. This was my life," she said, and twice tried to commit suicide. Now she works at Sheltering Wings to help others escape their own bleak situations. *"I wish there had been a place like this and people like you when I needed them. I'm grateful to be here now."*



... **Areta, who went from homeless and abused to manager and homeowner.** She and her kids fled abuse to the rock that is Sheltering Wings barely a month before Areta's fourth child was born. She finished school and showed dedication at work - now she's in management and moving into her own home soon. "Even though there have been so many things stopping me, I'm making sure I succeed to put my kids on the right path. *It's like stepping up a ladder, little by little. I'm loving every bit of it.*"



... **Becca, a teen who learned that love didn't mean control and violence.** Her new boyfriend wanted to be with her constantly, but what Becca thought was love became abuse - hitting her, telling her what to wear, threatening suicide to keep her in line. She thought domestic violence happened "only to married people" until a family gathering opened her eyes to what love and support really mean. Now she's the rock for other teens. *"I just wish I'd known. I never thought it would happen to me."*

Domestic Violence

is flooding the land

2021 was a year of metaphorical rain, floods and unrelenting winds. As uncertainty, fear and isolation continued to divide us from each other, they also forced too many of us into untenable situations at home.

For the second year in a row, shelters across Indiana saw shorter stays than pre-COVID – and a 181% increase in deaths at the hands of an abuser.* We saw the same trends here at Sheltering Wings:

- We answered **1,347 crisis calls in 2021**. That's an average of **26 crisis calls every week**.
- We gave **shelter to 303 survivors** of abuse. That's taking in **almost one man, woman or child per day of the year**.
- We served families with heart-breaking stories of **abuse of pregnant women** and trends of escalating violence.

As the need for services intensifies, so too does the importance of your kindness. As COVID wore on in 2021, support from foundations, individuals and community partners allowed us to preemptively address how to keep our families safe and to remain flexible to meet the needs of our most vulnerable clients.

Our shared work is more vital than ever. We thank God for leading each of you to Sheltering Wings. Together, we will keep our house built on the rock of the Lord's love, safe and strong.

Support reaches Beyond Our Shelter Walls

What happens when someone needs our help but can't come to the shelter? Or when a survivor is ready to leave us but isn't quite prepared to handle all the responsibilities of living on their own? 2021 brought answers to both those questions. Mobile advocacy, Haven Homes and other housing initiatives take trauma-informed services to survivors and communities outside our walls.

Mobile Advocacy: Meeting survivors wherever possible.

"Mobile" means we meet a survivor wherever they feel safe: a park, the library, a coffee shop or our office in the Haven Homes clubhouse. By shifting the burden of getting help from the survivor to us, we help them focus on how they rebuild control over their own lives.

Permanent Housing Support: Helping survivors live on their own.


Haven Homes opened in December of 2021, amid of tears of gratitude and happiness. This supportive-housing apartment community removes barriers for survivors who are ready to leave our shelter, but need affordable housing assistance, domestic abuse support, or mental health services. The apartments are open to both survivors served by Sheltering Wings and anyone else who needs affordable housing solutions.

Including, but not limited to Haven Homes, we've also helped survivors access funds for Rapid Rehousing; a nationally accepted strategy for solving homelessness, and Permanent Supportive Housing, a program that serves the most vulnerable chronically homeless people, pairing case management and supportive services, to assist the needs of the client.

Case managers work closely with clients to set goals, build life skills, and work toward stability. We continue to seek diverse options to help clients find safe, permanent housing and set them up for success once they're ready to exit Sheltering Wings.

Case Managers *become a Survivor's Rock.*

A case manager once told us, "When you're in an abusive relationship, it becomes your reality. It's the only thing you know." A case manager's job, then, is to help survivors create a new reality.

A case manager does a check-in for every new resident and then performs periodic assessments to see what resources they need as they work toward independence. Often, the relationships formed between survivors and case managers turn into much deeper ties. Case managers are like best friends or family members: They make sure a survivor's children are enrolled in the proper school. They find a temporary home for the family pet. They go on court visits and medical appointments. Our case managers have even been at more than one survivor's bedside during childbirth!

Our case workers started new relationships with 127 new residents in 2021. We look forward to sharing their stories in 2022.

Domestic Violence

is preventable

Prevention starts when we teach young people and our families the value of a healthy relationship.

With your help, we can break down the stigma, and make domestic violence easier to recognize and respond to. We're working to do this through evidence-based educational materials and trainings for our community. Through our primary (meaning before abuse starts) prevention initiatives, such as our healthy relationships curriculum for teenagers and our Men IN Action Program, we hope to build strong families and equip our community with the information and resources needed to build those relationships.

We invite your partnership in prevention. Please join our prevention network to create strong families, and individuals free from abuse.
