One Resident's Story:

Children Learn What They Live

Helping someone escape abuse can turn more than one life around.

Sarah endured unspeakable verbal, emotional, spiritual and sexual abuse from her husband for 15 years. People told Sarah she just needed to be a better, more obedient wife. When they had two daughters, he abused them.

These two little girls were absorbing lessons about how much of themselves someone has to give up to keep their partner happy. They were learning that girls don't contradict, speak up or do anything their partner won't like.

The oldest daughter's anxiety manifested as painful stomach cramps; she wanted her parents to divorce. The youngest told Sarah she wanted to run away because she was afraid of her father.

The three ultimately found safety inside Sheltering Wings, where we protect families like theirs every day. Now, Sarah and her two impressionable girls are learning together that abuse isn't the way life and families are supposed to be.

"So husbands ought to love their own wives as their own bodies; he who loves his wife loves himself. For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as the Lord does the church. For we are members of His body, of His flesh and of His bones." Ephesians 5:28-30

Protecting Families

through Prevention & Education

Protecting people from abuse starts long before someone shows up at our door. Adults, teens and children who know what healthy relationships look like have a better chance of avoiding abuse. Here are highlights from our 2022 prevention and education efforts, made possible by your continued support:

Men IN Action

A group of engaged, informed men working to end relationship violence by modeling and encouraging positive social behaviors for young men and boys in the community.

Coaching Boys Into Men piloted with youth coaches in the Danville Community School Corporation. Often filling mentor and even parental roles in a young man's life, these coaches are learning how to promote respectful behavior among their players and prevent abuse.

Men IN Action Read returned to elementary schools for the first full year since the pandemic. Volunteers read aloud from "Marisol McDonald Doesn't Match / Marisol McDonald No Combina," the story of a biracial girl who finds joy in being herself.

The annual **Men IN Action Breakfast** featured Tony Maners, best known for umpiring the longest game in organized baseball history. He shared tips for encouraging youth learned from calling college and minor-league games.

Teens That Talk Youth Council

Teens who talk frankly to other teens about healthy relationships and teen dating violence.

Members sought partnerships with like-minded school clubs: leadership, life skills, community service, mental health and others, and they enhanced several school presentations by our prevention and education officer with their insights.

SkyZone renewed its five-year partnership for Hop for Hope, an annual free event hosted by the Council and free to public. Attendees learn about relationship resources and experience a safe, encouraging environment.

The Shift to Online Education

The demand for online educational resources has increased significantly for us since the pandemic, so we responded by creating new digital and on-demand content.

Growing Up Strong

This original summer video series guided parents and caregivers in building on the 40 developmental assets vital to a healthy child's growth. This year, we added Growing Up Strong conversation cards to the series to keep the lines of communication between generations open.

Foster Care Education

In Indiana, foster parents must complete a certain number of hours of education. We presented a six-part series on domestic abuse, teen dating violence, childhood developmental assets and more.

Sneak Peek Into 2023

In-shelter prevention-based program to break the cycle of abuse, hospital partnerships to reach new fathers and families, mentors throughout the community and much more to protect and build strong families.

SHELTERING WINGS

If you've followed Sheltering Wings this past year, there's a good chance you heard the message "We Know the Signs". Thanks to the generous funding from the Indiana Criminal Justice Institute through the Victims of Crime Act Formula Grant Special Project, we developed a public awareness campaign to promote the free trainings we offer for community members and organizational leaders to learn red flags, recognize signs of abuse and know where to find resources for victims.

We asked shelter partners to join in the fun and in August, more than 30 supporters, churches and organizations helped us launch the campaign on social media and through email messaging. Together, we posted campaign images and the hashtag #WeKnowTheSigns and directed folks to click through to our new training sign-up page, ShelteringWings.org/WeKnowTheSigns.

Results

During the reporting period, our training and resource website pages saw increased traffic of 964 unique visitors, far exceeding the goal of 750 unique visitors.

From October 2021 - September 2022, 40 trainings were completed and 6 trainings were scheduled for a future date best suited for each organization.


The earned media and press releases resulted in two news segments on FOX59 - a studio interview and a location segment at Sheltering Wings. These segments focused around the campaign and how our trainings are helping to break the cycle of abuse in central Indiana.

The campaign successfully reached thousands of people across all social media platforms, including an Instagram post reaching 162 accounts and making 206 impressions, and a Facebook post reaching 918 people, shared by 20 accounts.

Our partner social media efforts using a campaign image and/or #WeKnowTheSigns included 33 posts spanning across Instagram, Facebook, LinkedIn, and Twitter.

And we know the reach went even further, thanks to continued messaging and the news coverage.

Affordable housing is one of the greatest needs for survivors of domestic violence who are safe and secure enough to move out of Sheltering Wings.

The financial strain of keeping a roof overhead—not to mention vehicle, childcare, and education expenses—can be a major stumbling block between a determined survivor and sustained independence.

So, when the opportunity arose to partner with RealAmerica and Cummins Behavioral Health Systems, Inc. to bring a 52-unit supportive housing community to Hendricks County, we jumped in!

With great excitement and anticipation, we opened Haven Homes in December of 2021. Throughout 2022, Haven Homes has truly been a haven for our clients who have moved out of Sheltering Wings, but still receive our services.

We offer a variety of services at Haven Homes, such as case management and transportation, as well as classes like Financial Stability, Self-Love, Nurturing Parenting (DCS approved), and a Bible study.

To the clients served by Sheltering Wings, Haven Homes provides affordable housing when, under other circumstances, they may not have the opportunity to secure housing. Haven Homes provides a safe community with wrap-around services and ongoing case management to our clients to ensure the best possible outcome for them to have stable and independent lives.

Not only does this fully featured community serve former Sheltering Wings residents, but it also provides secure, safe, affordable housing for dozens of area families who need it.

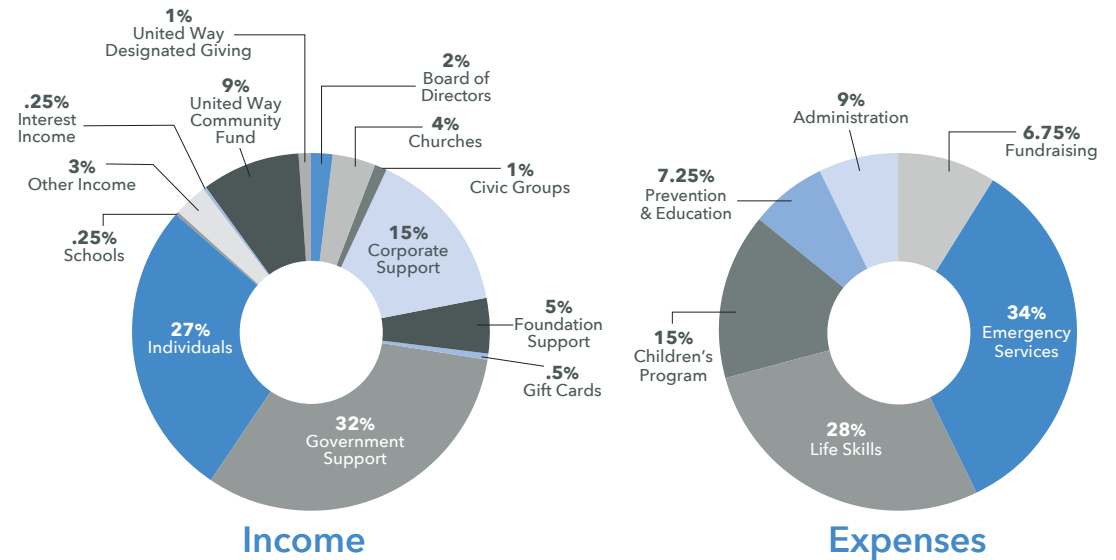
